At an elevation of only 250 m (820 ft.), Lillooet's climate combines the sunny skies of the interior with the moderating influences of the coast. Lillooet has one of the most pleasant climates in Canada: early sunny springs, warm dry summers, long mild autumns and short winters with just a touch of snow. It is not unusual for Lillooet to be blessed with over 300 hours of sunshine per month in the summer. During 50 years of record keeping, Lillooet has averaged fewer than 80 days of precipitation annually with the total rainfall and snowfall for the year averaging only 390 mm (15in). Our semi-arid climate means that Lillooet is virtually free of mosquitoes and other biting insects. The District of Lillooet is picturesquely located on the sage and pine covered bench lands of the Fraser River in South Central British Columbia. This location represents the junction of two major transportation corridors to the coast - Hwy 12 & the Trans Canada Hwy or Hwy 99 which is the most scenic route connecting the Lower Mainland and the Interior.

Lillooet is surrounded by a number of great recreational lakes. Whether you enjoy sun bathing, canoeing or waterskiing the 27 km long Seton Lake five minutes out of Lillooet provides a public beach and boat launch for cooling off in the summer months. The mighty Fraser River and its local contributories can satisfy any fisherman and snow-covered mountain peaks make the area an all-season paradise for outdoor recreation. Historically, with its 13 saloons, 25 licensed premises and clutter of cabins and tents, Lillooet had a shifting population of over 15,000 residents in the 1860's and was the biggest gold rush settlement west of Chicago and north of San Francisco. A few of our notable historical sites include the Old Suspension Bridge, Hangman's Tree, Chinese Rock Pilings, Miyazaki House, Mile 0 Cairn, Xwisten First Nation Traditional Fishing Rocks and the Japanese Canadian Internment Memorial Garden.

Today, the area boasts an enthusiastic and growing farming community, as well as an emerging beer and wine industry. Lillooet is home to families who have lived here for generations, and those who are taking a step out of the city to enjoy the lifestyle it has to offer. It has a hospital, medical and dental clinics, fire and police departments, highway rescue services, ambulance services and a university training and education centre.

Lillooet also has a Recreation Centre that it keeps full of hockey fans!

TOURNAMENT INFORMATION/EVENT DATES AND TIMES:

BANQUET: SATURDAY MARCH 16, 2019

The banquet for players, Coaches, Managers and Officials will be held Saturday March 16, 2019 from 5:30 – 7:00 in the Rec Center Gymnasium. COACHES MEETING: SATURDAY MARCH 16, 2019

There will be a mandatory Coaches and Manager meeting on Saturday March 16, 2019 following the banquet. Meeting will begin at 7:30pm.

OPENING CEREMONIES:

The on ice opening ceremonies are scheduled for Sunday, March 17, 2019 at 6:45pm. Teams that play directly after the ceremonies are required to be fully dressed and ready to play. Opening ceremonies are mandatory for all teams. Players and coaching staff are asked to arrive at the arena one hour prior to opening ceremonies.

If your association/team has a banner with name or logo, please bring this with you to the opening ceremonies.

CLOSING CEREMONIES:

Closing ceremonies will be held following the Championship game. The fair play award will be announced at this time. Attendance at the closing ceremonies is not mandatory.

MANDATORY EQUIPMENT CHECKS:

The supervising referee lead will do an equipment check before the start of each team's first game and randomly anytime afterwards. Players with illegal/worn equipment will not be able to participate using illegal equipment. Bring extra helmet screws, gloves and tape. Ensure your team's Safety Person does an equipment check with your team before coming to the Championships to avoid any disappointment.

QUIPMENT	INSPECT	BASIC THINGS TO LOOK FOR
PANTS	Condition	- No tears, loose threads &/or dangling belts/straps. - Inside zippers done up and working.
STICK		- Plug is in butt end of the stick (top). - Blade has no sharp edges, breakages
HELMET	Condition	- Must have visible CSA label, snug chinstrap, ear guards, be decal/tape free & not painted. - No cracks in shell or padding.
FACEMASK	Condition	- No metal bars broken on cages - Tight screws and if replacements, NOT too long. - Straps snug with stretch in elastic - Clips in place. - NO cracks in plastic - watch for rust at wire seams
GLOVES	Condition	- High enough so covers wrist. Firm fingers, thumb and back padding - Palms soft and pliable. NO holes near fingers or in palm larger than a quarter) - No loose threads
NECKGUARD	Condition	- Completely covers neck - Fits snug enough to avoid exposing parts of neck and upper chest - MUST have BNQ certification, be free of fabric cuts - Velcro strap NOT worn and in good working order - Must not be altered in any way - Rips or tears should be sewn. - No tape wrapped around neck guard
