

No Team, League, or Association shall be entitled to enter competition or be represented at the Society's Annual General Meeting until its fees, assessments and fines, if any, have been paid.

RATIONALE:

Prior to 2011 the registrations of Minor Hockey recreational teams were not administered or monitored by BC Hockey. Starting in the 2011-2012 season player registrations and coach certifications were monitored by BC Hockey as part of a pilot project aimed at determining the most effective and consistent way to review these teams. This adjustment to procedures was necessitated in part by a requirement of Provincial Government funding setting out that all teams must have a certified coach, and has now become standard operating procedure.

This adjustment has been subsidized in the past two seasons by way of the allocation of funds from an excess of revenue over total expenses resulting from operations.

- b) Will be permitted to affiliate players from all associations from which they have registered players (Note: unless a categorization exemption has been granted under this regulation).
- c) Exemptions to this regulation are subject to the following:
 - An Association recategorized in this manner may apply to the BC Hockey Executive Committee to have a division exempted from the recategorization. All exemption requests must be submitted to the Executive Director prior to November 15
 - ii. Where players from another Association register due to the inability of that other Association to form a team because of insufficient registration, then the recategorization in accordance with the preceding will be at the discretion of the BC Hockey Executive Committee.
 - iii. Associations that share a common geographic subdivision may apply to the BC Hockey Executive Committee for exemption from this provision.

For the past several years Associations have had to wait until the BC Hockey Semi-Annual meeting to find out what tier they will be classed. The process leaves Associations, Leagues and Districts waiting for answers. In a Branch where we must do Appeals within 14 days it seems inconceivable that dealing with player transfers should not take more that. The potential for waiting until the BC Hockey Semi-Annual meeting to deal with transfers is way too long to wait. Leagues are waiting to finalize their Play offs, and the teams affected are late if they want to withdraw from Championships.
